Convenient ways to pay your WFEC bill

aying your West Florida Electric Cooperative bill has never been easier. With the recent addition of Regions Bank in Bonifay, you now have a choice of ten local banks where you can make payments to your WFEC account, even if you aren't a bank customer there.

Area banks that accept WFEC bill payments also include the Regions Banks in Chipley, Blountstown and both Marianna locations; C & L Banks in Blountstown and Altha; and PCB Banks in Marianna, Greenwood and Malone. You may pay any WFEC bill on or before the due date, whether for electricity, Internet service, a DSS lease or appliances, at any of these locations. However, if your bill is past due, you must visit WFEC's district office or mail your payment directly to the Co-op.

In addition to convenient collection points, WFEC offers the following options to make your bill-paying as simple a chore as possible:

Bank draft bill payment – Your monthly electric bill can be paid directly from your bank account.

Levelized billing – After one year of service, your monthly charges can be based on an average of the previous 12 months' actual energy use for your home.

Credit card payments – WFEC accepts all major credit cards, so you can pay your bill over the telephone.

Double notification – At your request, WFEC will notify a third party, such as a landlord or caregiver, when an account is delinquent.
